Being a Good Getter

"Tis better to give than to receive." But, is it really?

Sometimes, sure. Most of the time, probably. But, not all of time. During this Christmas season, we've reflected on how it can be so much easier to give than to receive. The giver, in a relationship, seems to have the power over the receiver. The giver gets to decide what the receiver gets, and usually even is shown gratitude for it. The getter, however, is put into a humble position of getting whatever the giver chooses to give to them, having very little control of what that might be or when it might happen.

Giving feels good to do, especially giving something to someone who would not be able to get it for themselves. Why doesn't receiving always feel good though? Sometimes there is guilt that the giver "shouldn't have" or feelings of being undeserving and therefore uncomfortable about the gift. Now that we have been though this "season of giving," maybe we need to allow ourselves to enter a "season of getting"—allowing ourselves to be open to what God is offering us, freely. This might be through the gifts or acts of others, events in our lives, and through prayer and worship.

Each week at worship, God offers us free forgiveness of our sins, nourishment at Christ's table, the Holy Word at work in our world, and community with our sisters and brothers in Christ and the entire Communion of Saints. Do we receive this well? Do we allow ourselves to acknowledge how deep and wonderful this gift is, or do we brush it off when we take it possibly a bit ashamed that we are in such need of this gift; or maybe because we don't allow ourselves to see what is offered as really "real?"

Are you humble enough to allow yourselves to receive when something wonderful is given to you? Allow someone else, God especially, to have some of the power in relationships? Allow yourself to be cared for and nurtured by others, as we were created to do. God did not make us to be endless consumers of all things, and this can be an easy slope to slip down. But, we were also not created to be givers alone. We were made for relationships, and those have many levels of giving and receiving. Open your hands and hearts to receive what God has to offer to you!
