From the Pastors' Desk

Meaningful Journeys



The journeys that we take change us—whether it is a hike in the woods for a few hours, a relationship with someone else, the time we spend living in a certain place, a trip, a job, a difficult medical journey, etc. We don't come out on the other side of these things unchanged in some way; they become a part of who we are from then on, for the better or worse.

We also often refer to the season of Lent as a journey in the church—this time between Ash Wednesday and Easter when we remember with reverence Jesus' journey to the cross and beyond, and where we see just how immense God's love for us is. Often we are encouraged to mark this time by giving something up for Lent. In years past, we've given up things like chewing gum, soda, cheeseburgers, caffeine, and video games. But, we found that this often cheapened the great celebration of the Resurrection of Our Lord at Easter into, "Hooray, I get to go back to eating/doing ______ now!"—taking the emphasis off of the wonderful work of God and putting it on something completely trivial for ourselves.

Instead of "giving something up" or making a change for Lent this year, we invite you to allow the journey of Lent to make a change to you. A change that will become a part of who you are from now on, not one that will just disappear when Easter arrives. Here are a few suggestions:

- Take advantage of Sunday worship and Wednesday evening meals and study of the "Faces of Christ" here at Pleasant View
- Grab a copy of "The Word in Season" devotions that can be found for free around the PVLC building
- Commit to reading through a book or two of the Bible through the season of Lent. Pick one of the Gospels or a book you haven't spent much time with yet. Do this on your own, with a buddy, or your whole family.


The PVLC Hospitality Group will provide the main dish, sides, and beverages. Those attending are invited to bring an Italian-themed appetizer or dessert to share.

The 2018 Gathering will be in Houston, Texas June 27th through July 1st. The theme for this Gathering is **"This Changes Everything"** and is based on Ephesians 2:8:

> "For by Grace you have been saved through faith, and this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God."

On behalf of the Outreach Team, I'd like to extend a big "Thank You" to the entire PVLC and Latvian Lutheran congregations for your generosity in providing more than \$1,300 in gift cards for our "Adopt-A-Family" project during the Christmas season. This year, we sponsored the ten boys from Trinity House. Trinity House is a ministry sponsored by Lutheran Child and Family Services, which assists teenage boys with their transition from Lutherwood to adult life. Included in that transition is job training, mental health services, education, and transportation assistance.

A "gift tree" was placed in the PVLC narthex in December containing approximately 40 ornaments. Each ornament contained a gift card for one of the boys. The congregation was instructed to take one or more ornaments from the tree, buy the gift card noted on the ornament, return it to PVLC, and place it under the tree. Thanks to your generous hearts, all of the ornaments were spoken for!

On Friday, December 22, the gifts were delivered to LCFS. The reaction from the LCFS staff was one of overwhelming appreciation – priceless to witness!

Thanks again to the PVLC congregation and the Latvian congregation for all of your heartfelt generosity – affirming that both congregations truly care about our community. We're hoping to arrange a visit to PVLC from the boys sometime in February or March, furthering our relationship with this wonderful ministry.


